

Dr T. R. Shankar Raman

Dr T. R. Shankar Raman is a Senior Scientist with the Nature Conservation Foundation, Mysore. He holds a BSc degree in Zoology from Loyola College, Chennai, and a Master's degree in Wildlife Science from the Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun. During his Masters research he studied the effects of shifting agriculture on forests and wildlife in Mizoram, northeast India. Later, he obtained his PhD from the Centre for Ecological Sciences, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore. Shankar Raman's research focuses on tropical rainforest ecosystems and over the last two decades he has studied ecology of deer, antelope, primates, and elephants, besides rainforest birds and trees in various parts of India. He has represented his organisation (NCF) in the National Board for Wildlife and has prepared a background paper and draft guidelines on linear infrastructure projects for the NBWL. Presently, along with colleagues, he works out of the NCF's long-term field research station in the Anamalai hills of the Western Ghats, carrying out work on forest fragmentation, human -- wildlife coexistence, and ecological restoration.
